**MINUTES**

- ◆ **Call to Order:** Tom Sommers called the Remington Unified School District 206 Board of Education Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. on January 8, 2018 at the Remington District Office, 110 South Main, Whitewater, Kansas.
- ◆ **Members Present:** Tom Sommers; President, Kendall Claassen; Vice President, members, Doug Claassen, Jayne Carey, Brad Crisp, Jeff Klaassen, and Penny McNeill
- ◆ **Members Absent:** None
- ◆ **Others Present:** James Regier, Martina Bumm, Tammy Sweatland, and Brian Foster with United Sports Systems
- ◆ **Opportunity to Add Agenda Items:** none
- ◆ **Approval of Agenda:** Motion to approve agenda. (D. Claassen), seconded (Crisp), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Consent Agenda:** Motion to approve all items on the consent agenda. (K. Claassen), seconded (D. Claassen), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Patrons Open Forum:** No patrons requested to address the board.
- ◆ **Principals Reports:**
  - Tammy Sweatland (RES):**
    - Several new students enrolled at the start of the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, total enrollment is now at 194.
    - Christmas Program was a success, thank you to Mrs. Wollenberg for all her hard work.
    - RES raised 1,003 items for the District-wide food drive held in November/December.
    - Professional Development held in the afternoon on Jan 3<sup>rd</sup> involved student intervention teams and sorting students in tiers for MTSS reading.
    - The one school/one book event will begin soon. All students and staff will read the same book. Events relating to the book include: trivia, guest speakers, and art lessons (provided by Kathy Hisel, school nurse).
    - RES First Steps Play Group will have a meeting on Jan 11<sup>th</sup> from 2:15-3:15 in the RES library. Guest speaker will be Tanya Wollenberg, RES Music Teacher.
  - Bob Friesen (RMS-Summarized from report given to Board Members):**
    - 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> graders sang Christmas songs from their musical at Wheat State Manor in December.
    - RMS History Bee was held in December and sponsored by Mr. Rasmussen. Teams were made up of all grades. The members of the winning team qualify to take a test in Wichita.
    - 6<sup>th</sup> graders won the RMS contest for the annual food drive and earned time in the gym.
    - Professional Development on Jan 4<sup>th</sup> consisted of project based learning activities in the a.m. and guest speaker Jodi Grover from Esstack (discussing Self-Regulation skills) in the p.m.
    - D.A.R.E. graduation will be held Jan 10<sup>th</sup> from 2-3pm.
    - RMS Spelling Bee will be held Jan 12<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 p.m.
    - 6<sup>th</sup> graders will tour Butler County Comm. College on Jan 17<sup>th</sup>. They will have leadership/teamwork activities and also eat lunch at BCCC.

- Basketball is going well. The HOA tournament will be held at RMS in February.
- First Quiz bowl tournament will be held on Feb 2<sup>nd</sup>. Workers need to start at 4:00 p.m.
- Gym floors were stripped and resealed and look great.

**Tim Bumgarner (RHS-Summarized from report given to Board Members):**

- 1<sup>st</sup> semester went well. RHS changed from Seminar period to Advisory and shifted to a more traditional block schedule. Staff feedback on in-service day (Jan 3<sup>rd</sup>) was very positive. The number of students on the academic warning list is at its lowest point in 10 years.
- Will begin looking at class offerings for next year and will possibly look at expanding Career and Tech Ed pathways to include Education pathway.
- Currently, both boys and girls basketball teams are 2-5.
- Wrestlers competed at a very large tournament in Burlington and had several boys place in the top six and finished towards the front of the pack in the team standings.
- Jan 12<sup>th</sup> and Jan 13<sup>th</sup> Reagan Dillard and Marissa Welch will compete at the KSHSAA State Debate tournament in Coffeyville.
- Upcoming events include: Sterling BB tournament (week of Jan15th-19th), Jan 25<sup>th</sup> – wrestling at home (Senior Night), Jan 30<sup>th</sup> – Lil Bronco Cheer/Berean BB game, Feb 9<sup>th</sup> – Homecoming vs. Ell-Saline, Feb 10<sup>th</sup> – Wrestling Bronco Invitational at RHS

- ◆ **United Sports Systems:** Brian Foster, with United Sports Systems, was present to provide a second bid on the track project.
- ◆ **Out of District Students:** Motion to approve Max Nelson (Pre-K) as out of district student for the 2017/2018 school year. (D. Claassen), seconded (Carey), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Track Bid Selection:** Motion to approve 1st bid from Track Renovations: Black Impermeable track in the amount of \$499,346 and drainage (track, field and outlet) in the amount of \$58,000 for a total of \$557,346. (Crisp), seconded (McNeill), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Administrative Contracts:** Motion to approve extending contracts for James Regier, Tim Bumgarner, Bob Friesen, and Tammy Sweatland through the 2019-20 school year. (K. Claassen), seconded (Klaassen), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Policy Update:** Motion to approve Policy BCBK on Executive Session. Changes were made to the policy which effect the procedures school boards need to use when they recess into executive session. USD 206 has been utilizing this new procedure for months now, this policy simply supports current practice. (McNeill), seconded (Carey), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Technology Acceptable Use Policy:** Motion to approve updated policy. The policy needed to be updated to include Cyber-bullying to make it CIPA compliant in order to continue to receive E-Rate funds. Terminology has also been updated to reflect newer technology. (McNeill), seconded (K. Claassen), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Superintendent Report:**
  - Facilities Planning Meeting – Mr. Regier asked the board and they agreed to have a community group meeting on Tue., Jan 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:00 p.m. Athletic Directors will share information and then the community members will develop a project/facilities needs list.
  - KS Teacher of the Year nominee district tour – On Wed., Jan 10<sup>th</sup>, we will be hosting Lori Gillet and team of KS Teacher of the Year nominees for a district tour.
  - KASB policy books – Mr. Regier shared with the board that we currently keep board policies in several binders. Board agreed that the district should pursue switching to electronic versions of board policies if that is available. Mr. Regier will check with KASB to see what the options are.

- ◆ **Executive Session:** Motion to go into Executive Session at 9:25 p.m. to accept resignation of 1 employee pursuant to non-elected personnel exception under KOMA and the open meeting will resume in the board room at 9:30 p.m. (Carey), seconded (McNeill), carried 7-0. Board returned to open session at 9:30 p.m.
- ◆ **Action from Executive Session:** Motion to accept resignation of Tod Johnson as RHS Industrial Arts Teacher (Carey), seconded (Crisp), carried 7-0.
- ◆ **Adjournment:** Tom Sommers adjourned the meeting at 9:35 p.m.
